Chair Christine Coles called the meeting to order at 12:00pm.

Today's guests were introduced by Randy. Mike Gray, a wildlife biologist with ODF&W and Captain Chris Chapanar. Randy briefly covered the topic of information to be covered.

Mike Gray mentioned to the group that about the time the salmon began to run, they started 23 24 receiving calls about mid-August, regarding the signage posted on the Boardwalk concerning casting and fishing gear, "slip bobber fishing only." Angler regulations are governed by 25 ODF&W and are able to be enforced by Oregon State Police and the County Sheriff. We, as a 26 municipality, cannot regulate fishing but have the authority to limit where people fish at the 27

28 Boardwalk.

- Mike gave some background regarding the success in the salmon runs we're seeing today. 29
- ODF&W began holding over "smolts" at Blossom Gulch to acclimate and then they would be 30
- released. We are now seeing adult salmon returning. By doing such practices, it can create other 31
- 32 issues.
- 33 ODF&W are frequently being called with this type of concern and Mike mentioned that this
- being more of a discussion/informative meeting and not a presentation but by addressing issues 34
- 35 as a behavioral campaign has been favorable and have found by taking an educational/courtesy
- 36 approach to be most successful.
- 37 Since the Parks Master Plan adoption, the City Boardwalk was included as an asset and under
- that concept; this is the perfect time to redefine fishing locations and development specific to 38
- need. As a committee is being put together, it is a staff recommendation to invite Mike Gray to 39
- 40 become a member of this committee. Mike acknowledged that they would be happy to do that.
- Captain Chapanar shared with the board that city police are having a difficult time trying to deal 41
- 42 with the many issues arising on the docks with the many anglers at the Boardwalk. Chris gave some insight into the difficulties trying to enforce the issue of trespassing, property damage etc.
- 43
- They cannot enforce them unless a crime has been committed and/or witnessed and there is a city 44 45 ordinance in place. They can however enforce criminal mischief and damage to a vessel, if the
- dollar amount of the damage exceeds a certain range. They're objective is not to stop the 46
- recreation but to address problems as they arise. 47

48

- 49 A suggested option is to proceed with the Parks Master Plan and identify the need to build a
- fishing pier as a possible solution. Remind anglers to be courteous and that there are 50
- 51 consequences and can be liable for damages. Encourage fishing south of the tide gate but the
- 52 angler's perception of where the fish is will always be "at the tide gate" and they will try to
- 53 maneuver themselves in front of the tide gate or back on the boardwalk.
- 54 Randy suggested taking a proactive approach with design giving "teeth" to enforcement through
- 55 City ordinances, Parks Master Plan and not subjecting the boat owner to potential damage but
- 56 allowing the recreational fishermen to continue. Perhaps, the placement of security gates down
- 57 to the moored boats. Mostly the southern entrance as the north would be public access. Mike
- with ODF&W mentioned they had a Restoration and Enhancement (R&E) opportunity funded 58
- 59 through a surcharge on a fishing license. Funding can be on a match basis. The Charleston
- office can assist with the application as well as letters of support. 60

OLD BUSINESS/UPDATES -

- Mingus Park Hours: The commission would like to make a recommendation to the Council to 63
- close the park at dusk. Having a curfew helps give teeth for enforcement. It was asked of 64
- Captain Chapanar about enforcing city ordinances regarding the skateboard park, stage, dogs off 65
- leash and smoking. Captain Chapanar explained that it is on a "per call basis" but due to 66
- 67 resources, it becomes low priority.
- Approve Minutes of August 20th and September 10th Christine called for a motion to accept. 68
