**ISSUE:** Acceptance of funds for Pedestrian Safety Mini-Grant

**BACKGROUND:**

Over the last several years, the Coos Bay Police Department has submitted for and received grant funds for participating in different Traffic and Pedestrian safety programs to include the Three Flags Safety Belt Enforcement Campaign, DUII Task Force, and the Oregon Impact Pedestrian Safety Crosswalk Enforcement Grant. All of these programs are aimed at creating a safer environment for both pedestrians and the motoring public through education and enforcement of the motor vehicle codes.

For the 2016 Campaign period, Oregon Impact awarded the Coos Bay Police Department with \$4,950.00 to be used for overtime Traffic Safety Enforcement with emphasis on Pedestrian Crosswalk Safety.

The availability of these overtime grant funds will enable the Coos Bay Police Department to conduct focused pedestrian crosswalk safety enforcement within the city limits of Coos Bay.
