ISSUE: Public Hearing - Consideration of an Ordinance Regulating Smoking at or around City Facilities and City Parks

BACKGROUND:

At the City Council meeting on June 21, 2016 staff presented a report regarding a proposal to craft an ordinance banning smoking on Visitor Information Center's Campus. At the conclusion of the Council's discussion on the matter, staff was directed to draft ordinance amendments to ban smoking at all city owned and developed parks and facilities.

We currently have two ordinances in place regulating smoking: (1) in the parks which regulates smoking in Mingus Park and on or near the downtown Boardwalk; and (2) regulating smoking at or around the Library. Attached you will find a proposed ordinance amendment for the parks to include all developed parks (Mingus Park, John Topits Park, Eastside Park, Ed Lund Park, Taylor/Wasson Park, Windy Hill Park, South 10th Street Park, Hollering Place Wayside, Marshfield Pioneer Cemetery, Eastside Boat Ramp, Empire Boat Ramp and the Downtown Boardwalk.

In addition, attached you will find proposed ordinance amendment for the City's non-park public facilities which include City Hall, Public Library, Fire Stations, City Shops, and Visitor's Information Center. While the proposed ordinance does not include the Egyptian Theatre, Art Museum, Railroad Museum, Sun Museum and the various City wastewater treatment facilities as we contract with other entities to operate those facilities, the Council as the option of including those facilities should it choose to do so.

ADVANTAGES:

The public hearing will allow the Council to gather additional public input on this matter.

DISADVANTAGES:

Enforcement of the proposed ordinance is expected to impact Coos Bay Police Department resources; however the impact is expected to be limited.

BUDGET:

There will be a cost for the purchase on installation of signage and poles for designated no smoking areas. Total cost is not expected to exceed \$10,750 for materials and labor. The signs

will be installed by city staff. Funds for the materials will come from the appropriate General Fund budgets including Park's, City Hall, Library, State Gas Tax, and City Hall funds.

RECOMMENDATION:

If it pleases the Council, enact the attached ordinances.

ORDINANCE NO. ***

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 248, REGULATING ACTIVITIES AND USES WITHIN THE COOS BAY PARK SYSTEM, AS AMENDED BY ORDINANCE NO. 458, ORDINANCE NO. 428, AND ORDINANCE NO. 296.

The City of Coos Bay ordains as follows:

Section 2: Park Regulations. Section 2, "Park Regulations, is hereby amended to include Subsection 15, Smoking, to read as follows:

Section 2(15) Smoking. No person shall smoke within the boundaries of Mingus Park, John Topits Park, Eastside Park, Ed Lund Park, Taylor/Wasson Park, Windy Hill Park, South 10th Street Park, Hollering Place Wayside, Marshfield Pioneer Cemetery, Eastside Boat Ramp and Empire Boat Ramp. In addition, no person shall smoke upon or within 25 feet of the City's wooden boardwalk.

This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after enactment by the Council and signature of the Mayor.

ORDINANCE NO. ***

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING ORDINANCE NO. 459, CITY LIBRARY SMOKING RESTRICTIONS.

The City of Coos Bay ordains as follows:

City Library Restrictions Ordinance is hereby amended to include as follows:

Ordinance Title: City Facility Smoking Restrictions.

Prohibition: The smoking of tobacco or any other organic material in or about the Coos Bay City Hall, Public Library, Fire Stations, City Shops, and Visitor's Information Center shall be prohibited. The area encompassed by this prohibition shall be the above mentioned facilities, adjacent City property around the building and the parking area adjoining the buildings. This prohibition includes any and all devices by which tobacco or other organic material is burned for purposes of inhaling of the material created by such burning, including, but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, pipes, and e-cigarettes, as well as the discarding of any such smoking material.

This ordinance shall take effect 30 days after enactment by the Council and signature of the Mayor.
